## BIKE AWARENESS - Grade 4 Students ONLY

Our Bike Awareness Program will be commencing for Grade 4 students in CC, CD and CE this term on a Thursday morning. This commenced last week - Thursday 20 July, 2023 and will continue for the next five (5) weeks. All participating students will need a roadworthy bicycle and an approved helmet. The Bike Awareness Program forms an important part of the PE Program and all Grade 4 students are expected to participate.

## HOMEWORK

Homework has already been given towards the end of the first week of term, with the first set of tasks due back in week 2 (week beginning 17 July, 2023) and will require students to complete a reading, maths, and spelling component. Students will be required to complete at least four (4) nights of reading a week, where they will log this in their homework book. Students will also be expected to complete one assigned Mathletics task on their iPads and a multiplication wheel and spelling task in their homework book.

## HOMEWORK - Continued

Homework is an important task for students to be completing weekly to develop their independent organisational skills. Please continue to encourage your child to be handing their books in on a Thursday morning, for them to corrected and returned to the students on a Friday.

## INQUIRY

Students start with learning about how leadership works at DCE. They will explore how the JSC is elected and how principals, teachers and students run a school. Students will explore their local government and how they help the local community. They will focus on the roles of federal, state and local governments. They will learn what the differences are between a 'rule' and a 'law' and the importance of the key word 'fair' and how it relates to laws and rules. The unit will conclude with students promoting our school rules in creative ways to the school community.

## CURRICULUM

In Term 3 students will continue to be challenged as they engage in a range of learning areas across the curriculum. This term in our Writing sessions we will be developing narratives, focusing on creatives ideas, interesting word choice and using the structure of narratives. We will also be looking at explanation pieces and how language can be used precisely to explain how things work.

In Reading, students will build on their knowledge of the CAFÉ menu and use the CAFÉ strategies as they develop their love of reading. Students will commence Book Clubs within their grades, reading a novel in small groups, and discussing their opinions and understanding of their chosen text. Our class novel this term is Wizardmatch, which has already sparked an interest in many students as we have begun reading this amusing fantasy novel.

In CATCH Maths sessions, students will participate in Challenging Maths tasks where they are encouraged to persist, prove and problem solve. This term we will explore Multiplication and Division, before moving to Data and Representation, then Measurement of length, area, perimeter, shapes and angles.
