WRITING

Throughout the term the students have consistently worked on the CAFÉ strategies through reading independently, in pairs and in small groups, where they all have a role to play.



INQUIRY

Term 1 has seen the Enrichment Area tackle one of its favourite units, **Finding Our Voice through Democracy**.

We are learning all about Australian democracy and three levels of government.

This includes 'How laws are made and enforced', 'The stolen generation' and 'Voting rights'. The students are completing an independent inquiry where we will conduct a presentation at the end of the term.

MATHS

Maths is going full steam ahead in the Enrichment Area. We have all been engrossed in decimals, comparing them and ordering them on a number line. We are also tackling place value and using the four operations, including BODMAS.

Catch Maths is based around open ended questions and our daily sessions focus on challenging tasks, fluency and understanding, reasoning and game based play. We look forward to seeing a group of Enrichment students participate in the Maths Olympiad Program throughout the year.
